Role Playing in English Language Learning -

Speaking and Writing English

Instructions:

Using specific English vocabulary, set up a situation in which children will be needing to use certain words or phrases, in order to accomplish goals.

Below are some examples and a list of possible scenarios:

Example 1: In the grocery store, students must ask "clerks" questions about where certain foods are, and then go and pay for their food.

Example 2: Students are working as radio weather reporters. They must give reports on different types of weather affecting their towns.

<u>Example 3</u>: Someone pretends to be a new student at the school. The new student must tell another student what he or she did at their old school using <u>past tense</u> (I walked, played, learned) and the other student must tell the new student what they do at this school in the <u>present tense</u> (I play, watch, run).

Example 4: Students must come up with a job they would like to have one day, and then must act out their jobs without using any words.

A Doctor: pretending to heal someone, listening to their heart

A Teacher: reading a book, writing on the board

Example 5: Students are all doctors, and they have to describe different parts of the body and explain to people why it is an important part, writing down reasons why.
