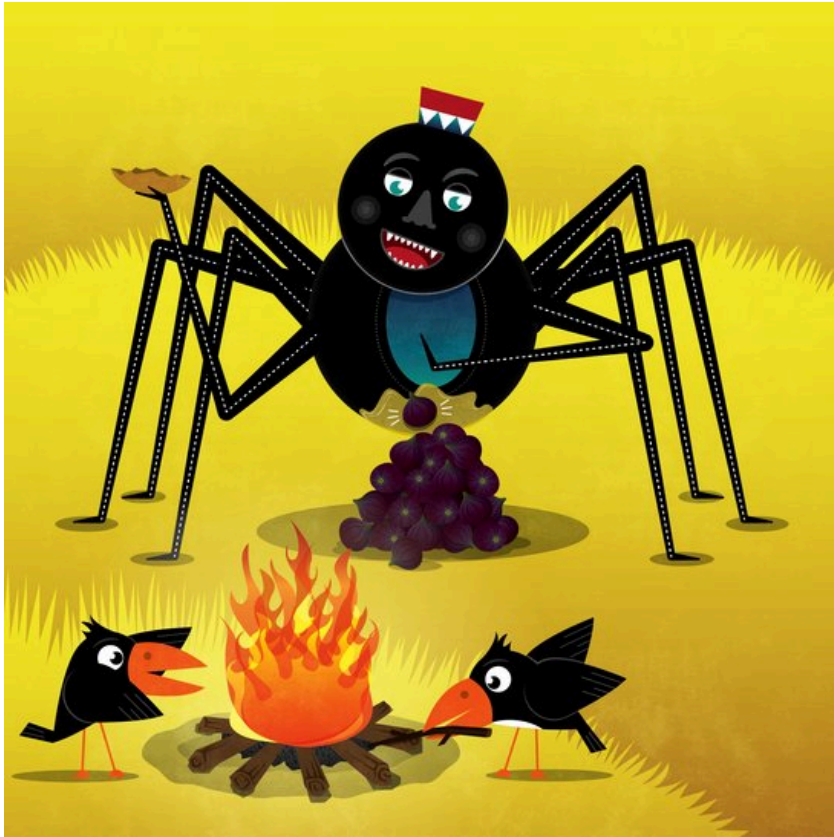

He was not eaten.

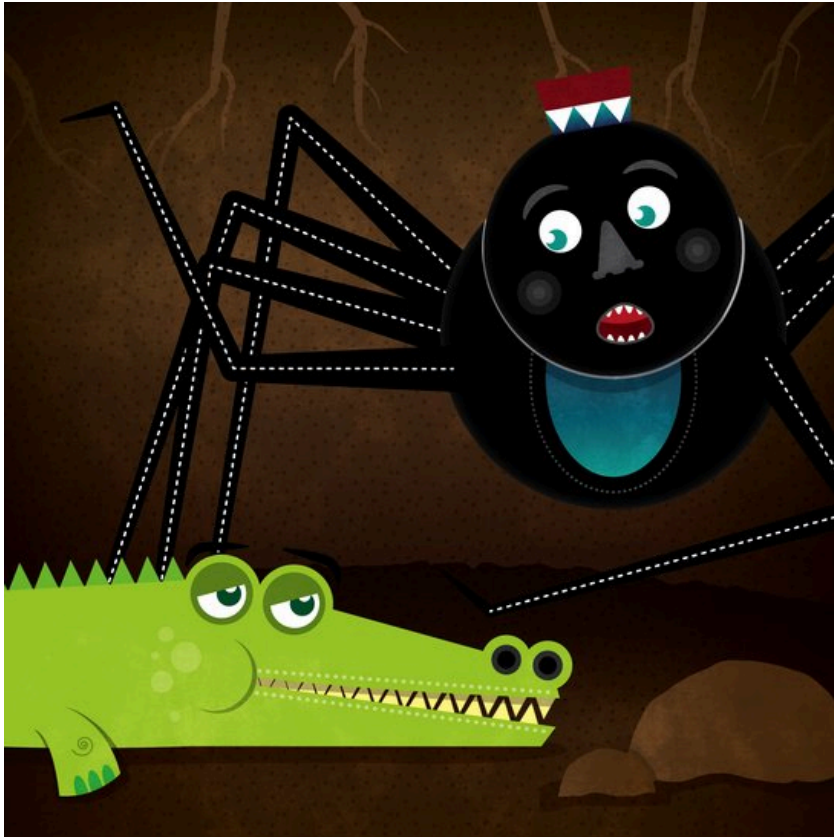


Anansi pretended to eat brown water, like the crocodiles.

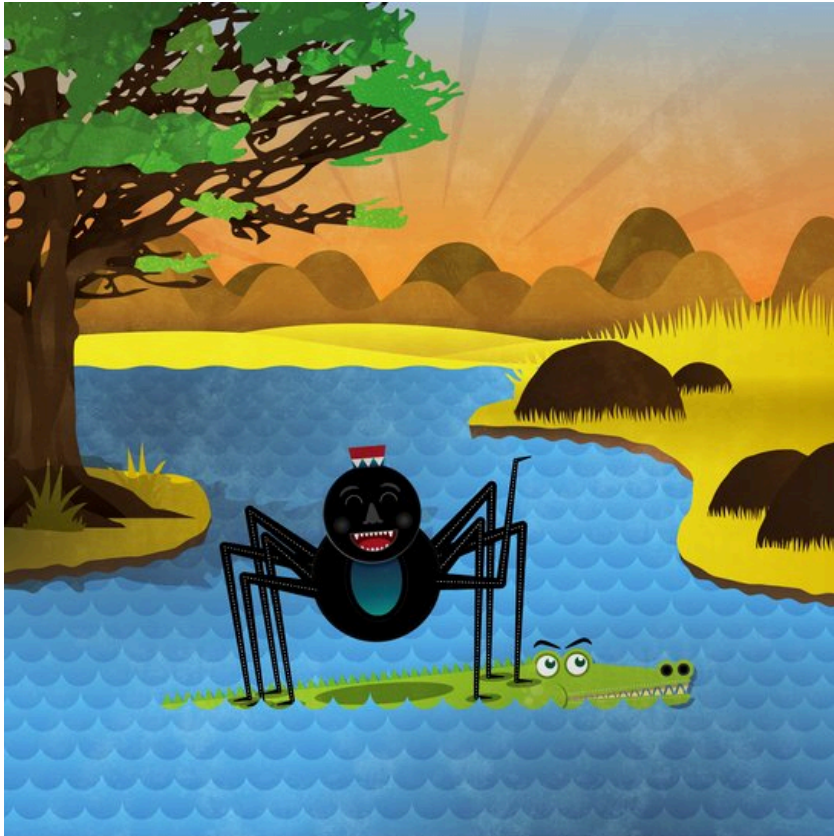


The crocodiles
