Guam's location in the western Pacific Ocean is approximately: 13 degrees north latitude and 144 degrees east longitude.

Definitions:

Typhoon - A tropical cyclone or hurricane of the western Pacific area with sustained winds over 75 mph.

Typhoon Condition 4 - Winds of 75 mph and above are possible within 72 hours.

Typhoon Condition 3 - Winds of 75 mph and above are possible within 48 hours.

Typhoon Condition 2 - Winds of 75 mph and above are expected within 24 hours.

Typhoon Condition 1- Winds of 75 mph and above are expected within 12 hours.








Monitor Lizard, *Hilitai*, Where do you go When the typhoon winds Begin to blow?



Sea Turtle, *Haggan*, Where do you go When the typhoon winds Begin to blow?


